The current playing field in West Butterwick was first initiated in 1954 when Sid Bains of the village took his old hat around the village asking for donations to purchase the land, an article subsequently published in the "Epworth Bells" reported that "The village has means of assembly second to none in Lincolnshire. Exactly 4.9 acres in extent, it is plumb level, well grassed and drained and a joy to the children who use it as proved on Saturday last on the occasion of the

annual sports held by the playing field association. Many have contributed to the success of the project, removing a pond, levelling, taking up the trees and hedges, under draining and preparing a sward which is a credit to West Butterwick."





These creditable standards are maintained as endorsed by the Judges of the Best Kept Village 2017. A more modern addition to the playing field is the Multiuse Games Area which provides the village with an all-weather play surface.
